The training completion report reflects the accomplishment of the six-month-long foundation training activities both academic and extra-curricular, methods, assessments, etc. to achieve the set objectives. I believe the FTC made them more equipped, and knowledgeable, created a positive mindset and they are working more confidently at their work more professionally.

This completion report attempts to cover all the 73rd Foundation Training Course commenced on 20 February and ended on 22 August 2022. 245 Participants were nominated by the Ministry of Public Administration. Out of which 214 participants participated in the course. One participant left the course due to maternal grounds, one participant could not succeed in one module. Finally, 212 participants successfully completed the course. They had to complete 24 modules under six thematic areas.

The objectives of the course are to enhance knowledge and skills and create a new mindset to improve public service delivery. From early morning to late night, they remain busy in academic as well as extracurricular activities to achieve the objectives of the course. 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### BPATC: An Introduction

Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre (BPATC) has been at the forefront of the development of public sector executives in the country. The Centre offers innovative training courses to equip future leaders and policymakers with a broad understanding of varied social, economic, political, environmental, scientific, and organizational aspects involved in planning national policies and strategies. In addition, the Centre arranges a good number of seminars and workshops on various issues of national and global concerns.

BPATC was established in 1984 by amalgamating the four institutions, NIPA, COTA, BASC and STI. BPATC is located at a distance of 28 kilometers from the capital city of Dhaka and on the way to National Mausoleum on the Dhaka-Aricha highway. The government enacted the Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre Act, 2018 (Act no. 64 of the year 2018) abolishing the ordinance of 1984 by which BPATC was established.

### Foundation Training Course (FTC)

FTC is the first and compulsory training course for civil servants entering the service. The contents of this course are designed so that the participants can understand different aspects of governance, development and different national institutions and policies to undertake their roles as civil servants. Since entry-level civil servants come from diverse academic areas and social backgrounds, it is essential to ensure that they have a common understanding of various theories, concepts and issues on administration and development in general and rules, regulations, processes and procedures for the public sector. However, apart from enhancing the professional knowledge of the trainee officers, the course also intends to enrich the behavior and character of the participants to enable them to perform their roles in the workplace with due sincerity, commitment, fairness and objectivity. The course also provides an opportunity for the officers to familiarize themselves with various dimensions of the history, culture and socio-economic development of the country. Instilling the spirit of liberation war and patriotism in the minds of participants is also a significant expectation of the course.

### 73<sup>rd</sup> Foundation Training Course

The Ministry of Public Administration issued Government Order on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2022 and nominated 525 participants for joining in the 73<sup>rd</sup> Foundation Training Course. The course was held simultaneously at the BPATC campus and other 5 (five) different training institutions, namely Bangladesh Institute of Administration and Management (BIAM), Dhaka; Bangladesh Institute of Administration and Management (BIAM), Bogura; Regional Public Administration Training Centre (RPATC), Chattogram; Rural Development Academy (RDA), Bogura; National Agriculture Training Academy (NATA), Gazipur. Four hundred and sixty-two entry-level civil servants took part in the 73<sup>rd</sup> FTC. Among them, two hundred and forty-eight trainees joined the FTC conducted at the training institutions outside of BPATC, while two hundred and thirteen participants took part in FTC at BPATC.

Since the FTC is the mandate of the BPATC, FTCs conducted outside BPATC at different institutions were organized under the direct supervision of the BPATC to ensure quality and coherence in training approach and design. Holding FTC outside BPATC is a temporary arrangement to address the training backlog.

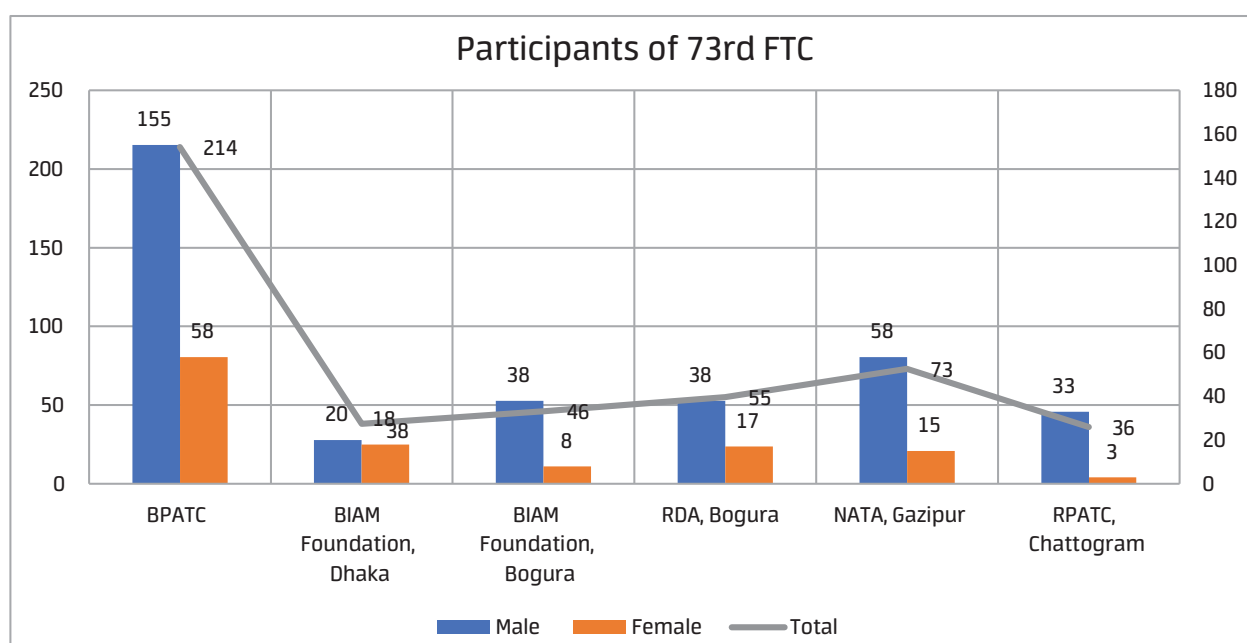


Figure 1: Institution-wise Distribution of Participants of 73<sup>rd</sup> FTC

### 73<sup>rd</sup> FTC at BPATC

To commence the 73rd Foundation Training Course the Ministry of Public Administration (MoPA) issued G.O. on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2022. A total of 245 (G.O. is shown in the Annexure-1) participants were nominated to join BPATC to accomplish the mandatory training course. Before starting, the Course Management Team (CMT) did all the preparatory work including course budget. A budget of taka 51591275.00 (Five crore Fifteen lac Ninety One thousand and Two Hundred Seventy Five) only was approved by the Rector, BPATC which is shown in the annexure-2. For better management, All the trainees were divided into six groups, and each group were directly guided by a Course Coordinator. In the Welcome Letter issued by the Course Director, all necessary instructions were provided to the nominated trainees. Following the nomination, on 19th February, a total of 214 participants (155 males and 59 females) joined the 73rd Foundation Training Course in BPATC in time, and the CMT warmly received them.

## Course Objectives

In general, the FTC intends to develop the trainee officers as skilled, innovative, proactive and well-groomed to be committed to the well-being and development of the people in an ever-changing national and global context. With the completion of the course, it is expected that the participants will be able to:

- develop an insight into the national goals and objectives by analyzing sociocultural, political and economic development issues, strategies and processes realistically;
- understand the role of leadership in the public sector;
- recognize the role of civil servants in a changing national and global environment;
- have a broader understanding of different national goals such as Vision 2041 and Delta Plan 2100, including the SDGs or Agenda 2030 and its localization;
- know essential laws, basic service norms, rules, policies and procedures;
- identify the root causes of the challenges that marginalized people are exposed to and to find the sustainable approach and strategies to address those challenges;
- understand the need to utilize the ICT in service process simplification and efficient management of public services;
- be able to prepare analytical reports within the stipulated time and present them before a large audience;
- communicate in English with competency and confidence;
- foster esprit de corps and empathy among the participants coming from diverse academic and socio-economic backgrounds;
- maintain physical fitness and ethical values.

## Course Contents

### Thematic Area and Module

To achieve the objectives of the course, the Curriculum Development Committee developed 24 modules under five thematic areas shown below. Under the modules 220 session topics are set to complete during the stipulated time. The detailed topic titles are shown in the annexure-3. Moreover, the CMT and Evaluation Department intensively monitor the overall performance, conduct, discipline and attendance of the participants.

## Chapter Two

### Inauguration and Other Related Activities

#### Briefing

The participants of the 73rd Foundation Training Course reported at BPATC at 4 PM on 19th February. The course began with a rigorous briefing in the evening in the first formal meeting by the CMT. The briefing from the course management team is vital for the success of the Course. Along with the documentary guidance provided by the course brochure, the consultation by the course director highly impacts the trainees staying here at BPATC. As the course briefing covers so many aspects (from the mindset to dress code), it helps the trainees to know the nitty-gritty of the Course.

On 20th February, ice-breaking, module briefing, service briefing, laptop distribution and medical check-ups were arranged. Through the service briefing, the trainees usually come to know what services they will have during their stay at BPATC. The Foundation Training Course curriculum consists of 24 modules. At the beginning of the course module, the director briefed the participants on each module, like module objectives, evaluation methods, and marks distribution, to give a primary idea about the modules.

#### Inaugural Ceremony

The 73rd Foundation Course commenced on 20th February 2022. Mr Farhad Hossain MP, Honourable State Minister, Ministry of Public Administration, was the chief guest (connected online). At the same time, Mr K M Ali Azam, Senior Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, was the special guest. Mr Ramendra Nath Biswas, Rector, BPATC, chaired the inaugural ceremony. The Head of the other five organizations DG BIAM, NATA, and RDA spoke on the occasion. The speakers underscored the need for

foundation training as one of the important ways and means to build the career of the participants and improve the service to the citizens.

### **Corona Vaccine Program**

The 73rd FTC has been inaugurated during Covid-19 Pandemic. A large number of the participants did not complete their vaccination before joining the course. That is why with the help of Civil Surgeon Dhaka and UH&FPO Savar, Corona Vaccine Programme was arranged at BPATC Auditorium on 31 March 2022. Trainees mainly provided booster doses of the Covid-19 vaccine here. Along with trainees, the official/staff of BPATC were also vaccinated on that day.

The coronavirus has been the biggest disaster of human civilization in the last few years. This disaster occurred in Bangladesh on 8 March 2020, and the situation worsened, and many people lost



their lives. When the whole world was disoriented, the vaccine showed the light of hope to the world. Even in Bangladesh, the death rate due to corona decreased rapidly after vaccination. Bangladesh Public Administration Training Center (BPATC) started 73rd FTC on 20 February 2022. A total of 213 trainees participated in this 73rd course, out of which only 100 had completed the Corona vaccine booster dose before starting the training. Of the remaining 113, 110 completed the second dose and 03 completed the first dose only. Later during the training, the trainees need to receive a booster dose and a second dose of vaccine. For this, 113 trainees would have to go to 113 different places to get the corona vaccine, wasting valuable training time. However, the BPATC authorities took initiative to ensure that the ongoing training is not disrupted. They arrange booster and second-dose vaccines for the trainees at the BPATC campus. This saves valuable training time and money. Along with the trainees, 62 officers, employees and female trainees, along with accompanying attendants, received the Corona vaccine.

### **Committee Formation**

The participants have to perform diversified co-curricular activities during training. A number of committees have been formed among the participants to perform extracurricular activities with highest discipline. Through the committee activities, the participants can develop their managerial capabilities. The committees are a) Mess Committee

- b) Cultural Committee
- c) Sports Committee
- d) Souvenir Committee
- e) Environment Committee
- f) Tour Committee
- g) Audit Committee

Each committee is headed by a president and a member secretary. The Mess Committees were mainly responsible for arranging their food five times daily i.e breakfast, morning tea, launch, evening tea, and dinner. The six Mess Committee arranged food in six months one after another. Similarly, other committees performed their duties as per terms of reference.

### **Learning Diary and Monitoring App**

In the 73rd FTC, trainees were provided with a learning diary so that they could maintain the essential activities of every day. Here in Learning Diary, the participants maintained what was their essential learning among massive daily activities. At the end of the course, the concerned Course Coordinator examined the Learning Diaries. Alongside the trainees, an app was maintained by the members of CMT to record the day-to-day performance/ nitty gritty of the participants. The purpose of introducing the learning diary and the app was to evaluate the participants and prepare the pen picture for the trainees so that CMT could make a true reflection. For example, if a trainee did cheerful work, it was inputted in the app as well as the negative one. It helped the CMT to evaluate the Trainees finally.

### **Rector's Tea at BPATC**

The Rector's of the 73rd Foundation Training Course was held on 23rd February 2022 at the Basketball ground of Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre. Respectable Rector (Secretary) of

BPATC, Mr Ramendra Nath Biswas, presided over the function. Along with 214 trainees of FTC, respected CMT and faculty members of the Centre were also present on occasion.

Rector's tea is tradition of BPATC to welcome the new trainees for the next six months of training. At the same time, the hall buzzing with the gathering of all faculty members of the Centre evoked the harmonious coexistence of BPATC with the disciplined and systematic life of the trainees. This lovely event was organized through the introduction of the participants and faculty members each other. The respectable Rector of the Centre formally welcomed the participants and offered refreshments like Pitha-Puli and tea entertainment.

Also, the warm exchange with everyone bridged the distance between trainer and trainee, reminding us of Rabindranath's Susim Cha-chakra held at Santiniketan on 22 Shravan 1331 (Bangla).

Rector had a free-flowing discussion with the trainees on the socio-economic development of the country and the cadres entrusted with it. Pledge to be committed to fulfilling responsibilities.

Hon'ble Rector Sir announced the end of the Rector's Tea by expressing the hope that the future artisans making Sonar Bangla can turn themselves into efficient soldiers of nation-building and strengthen the economy of Bangladesh by maintaining their morals and harmony in official arrangements. Thus, the half-year-long 73rd Foundation Training Course was auspiciously started with a formal tea ceremony by the Rector of BPATC.

## Academic sessions

There are 24 modules under Six (6) thematic areas. Seventeen (17) modules are evaluated in 1000 marks. A total of 220 classes are conducted during the six-month long courses.

### Resource Persons Conducting Sessions

Faculty members of BPATC, eminent guest speakers conduct the sessions of different courses. The guest speakers include honorable ministers, State Ministers, members of parliament, senior bureaucrats both sitting and retired university professors of home and abroad, Privet sectors officials, UN officials facilitate the training sessions, they shared their experience, motivate the participants to make them professional civil servants (the lists of the guest speaker are shown in Annexure-3).

## Training Evaluation

Evaluation of a training course is necessary to measure its effectiveness to improve its quality. The literature on training evaluation suggests four levels of evaluation - reaction level, learning level, job behaviour level, and functional level. Following the evaluation policy of the Centre, the Evaluation Department follows the first two levels regarding the evaluation of its training courses. The Centre follows some basic and standard mechanisms for all courses: Core Courses and Short Courses. On the one hand, participants are evaluated based on their performance. On the other hand, they evaluate the training methods, course management, external and internal speakers, and facilities and services provided by the Centre. In the subsequent sections, this chapter will give a brief look at the evaluation system of the Centre.

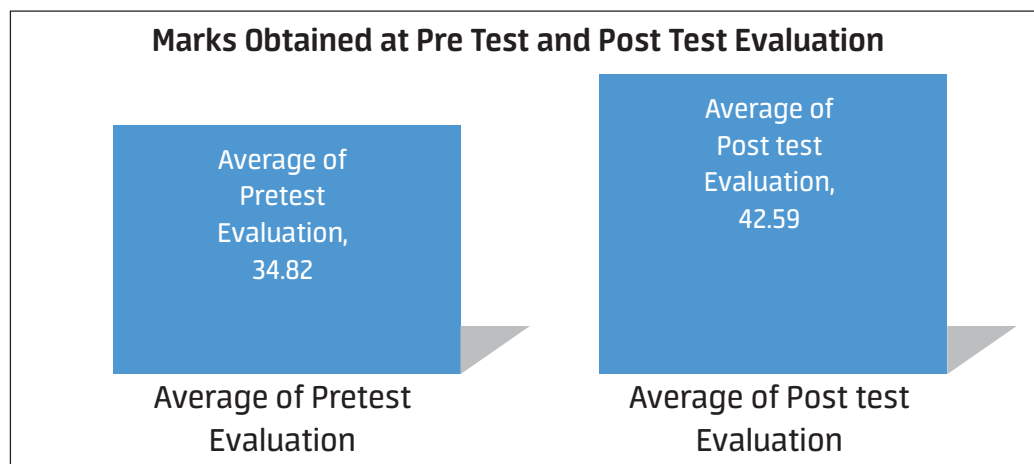
The participants are graded based on their performance. Their performance reports are forwarded to the concerned Ministries/Divisions/Organisations for retention in the officers' dossier. Assessments are based on the quantitative scale shown below:

### Pre-Test and Post Test Evaluation

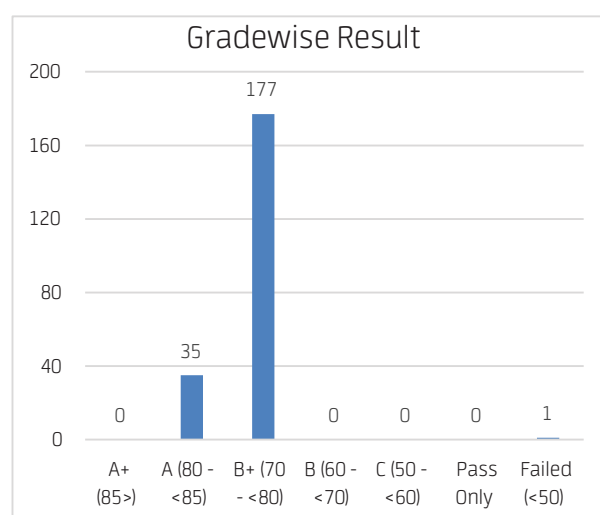
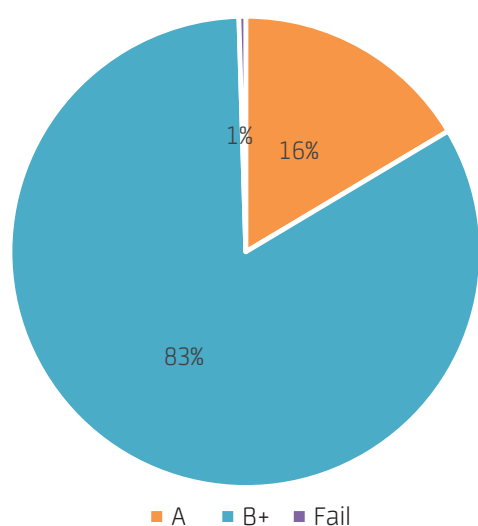
At the very early stage of Foundation Training Course a test is taken based on some basic question to assess the trainee's initial level of knowledge. At the end of the course there is also a provision of evaluation the participants course end knowledge level. The questions of the pretest and posttest evaluation were exactly the same. Here 73rd FTC we found that in pretest evaluation trainees average score was 34.82 (out of 50) whereas at posttest it increased to 42.59. So in pretest they got 69.64% marks but in post they secured about 85% marks which is an increment of about 15.54% on average.



## Course Evaluation

In the Foundation Training Course, mid-term and course-end evaluations are done. Besides written evaluation, an open-ended oral evaluation is also carried out in all the courses. BPATC has digitalised its activities through Enterprise Resource Planning software, where evaluation is a part. Here results are processed online. Firstly, following the Training Evaluation Policy of BPATC, the Program, Planning and Recording (PPR) wing issues course guidelines for all types of courses. Training modules, evaluation methods, allotted marks, and module directors are selected and entered into the software. Then module directors submit their scores after evaluating participants' group/individual performance. Thus, the merit list is finalised by the Evaluation Department with the approval of the authority. The participants are evaluated on 1000 marks in total.

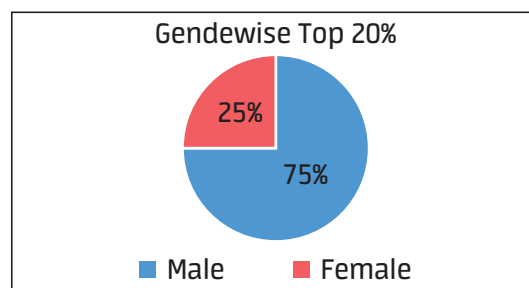


## Merit Position of top scorers (20%) in Foundation Training Course

Among the trainees, the top 10% are usually placed in merit positions. However, this time there is a change in the rule. The top 20% of trainees achieved merit positions as well as Merit Medals. A total of 93 participants got the merit positions as a 20% of the total 461 trainees. Among the 93 trainees, 58 were from BPATC (**shown in the Annexure-5**), and the rest 35 were from other institutions. Position 1 to 10 was secured by BPATC trainees, including the Rector Medal. The merit position of the participants of the 73rd Foundation Training Course (FTC) is shown in the following table.

## Certificate Awarding and Oath Taking

The Certificate Awarding and Closing Ceremony of the 73rd Foundation Training Course is another memorable event for this course. Honourable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, MP, graced the occasion (virtually) as a chief guest on 22nd August 2022. Mr Farhad Hossain MP, State Minister, and Mr K M Ali Azam, Senior Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, adorned the ceremony as guests. The auspicious occasion was chaired by the respectable Rector of the centre, Mr Ramendra Nath Biswas. He presented the summary of the course in front of honorable Prime Minister and the audience. All the 461 trainees (BPATC & five other institutions) assembled in BPATC on that special day to receive their certificates. The program was divided into two parts. In the first phase, all the successful trainees were awarded certificates by the honorable State Minister. In the second part, the honorable prime minister bestowed the Merit Medals and Certificates of Excellence to the top 20% of trainees (list is in Annexure). Upon awarding the certificates Rector of the center conferred responsibilities to the trainees. Later on, he conducts an oath taking to the participants so that they can discharge their duties as per the knowledge gained from the training. The oath was inspiring to serve the people professionally. It is pertinent to mention here that a few lines have been added to the existing oath by the honorable Prime Minister herself **(the oath is in annexure-6)**.



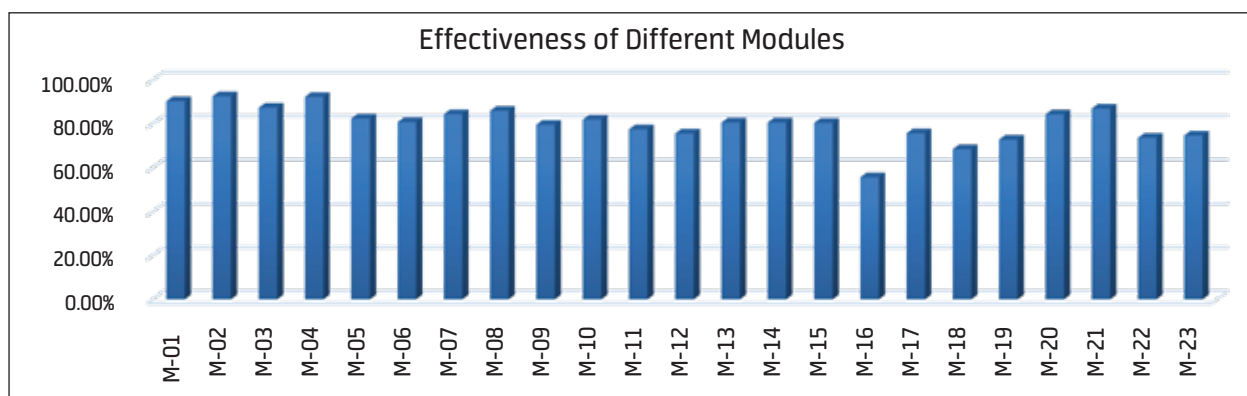
## Achieving the Course objective

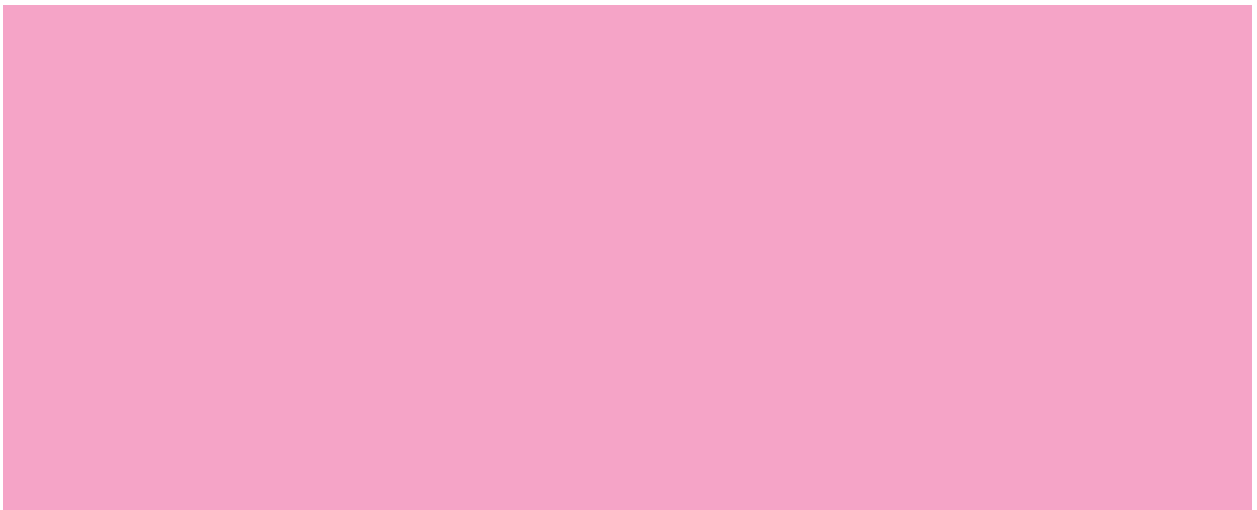


### ICT

To achieve the objective, the sessions on Digital Communication, Basic Hardware and Troubleshooting (Hard-ware & Software), Document Preparation, Blind Typing (Bangla & English), Presentation Preparation, Spreadsheet Analysis, Office Automation: ERP, e-services, Digital Bangladesh: Concept and Selected Initiatives, Cloud Computing: Concept and Usage, Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR): Internet of Things (IoT), Big Data, Block Chain, Crypto Currency, Digital Security Act-2018 were conducted by ICT experts.

## Car Driving

### Driving Training and Licensing Activities

**Event:** Driving training and licensing activities

**Participants:** 73rd FTC (Six Sections)

**Date:** March-August 2022

**Venue:** BPATC Premises

The theoretical and hands-on driving training and license issuance program is integral to 73 FTC. This training is compulsory for trainees with no previous driving license. As part of this, theoretical teaching on light motor vehicle parts, traffic signals, traffic laws etc., is done first. The trainees are then issued a learner's license through an online application under the supervision of the course management team. BRTA instructors give them mandatory 18-day hands-on/practical driving training. After successfully completing the training phase, a driving test is conducted by BRTA for the first time on the institute's premises with the joint efforts of the course management team. Needless to say, earlier, the trainees had to go to BRTA, Gazipur, to attend the said driving test, which was quite time-consuming and challenging. After that, the passed trainees completed the remaining formalities related to driving licenses at the regional office of BRTA in Mirpur under the supervision of the course management team. In this way, in a concise period, the trainees effectively get driving training and a driving license. It is to be noted that to meet the challenges of the fourth industrial revolution and as a member of the current civil service of the developed Bangladesh of 2041, all trainees must have experience in driving motor vehicles. From that point of view, this initiative of the Bangladesh Public Administration Training Center undoubtedly deserves praise.



## Swimming



### Morning PT and Afternoon Sports

Morning Physical Training (PT) and afternoon games are two exciting events in FTC. There is no denying the importance of physical activities to keep the participants physically fit and mentally strong. The 73rd FTC started their days by assembling in the PT ground at the dawn. After ensuring their presence, they used to walk a 2.20 KM jogging track and then went through rigorous physical activities under the trained instructors. FTC trainees needed to participate in the physical conditioning and afternoon games session. **Participants:** 73rd FTC (Six Sections)

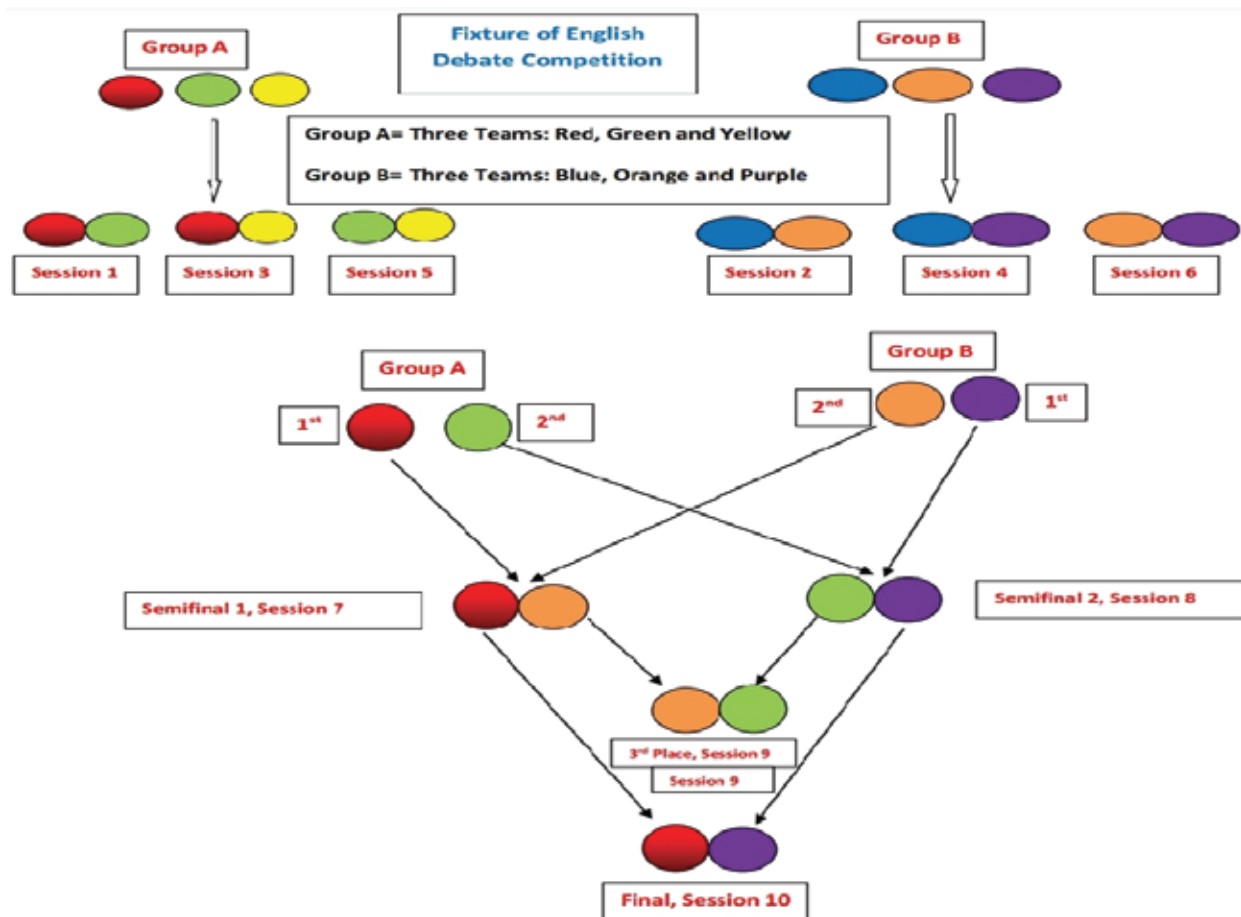
**Date:** September- August 2022

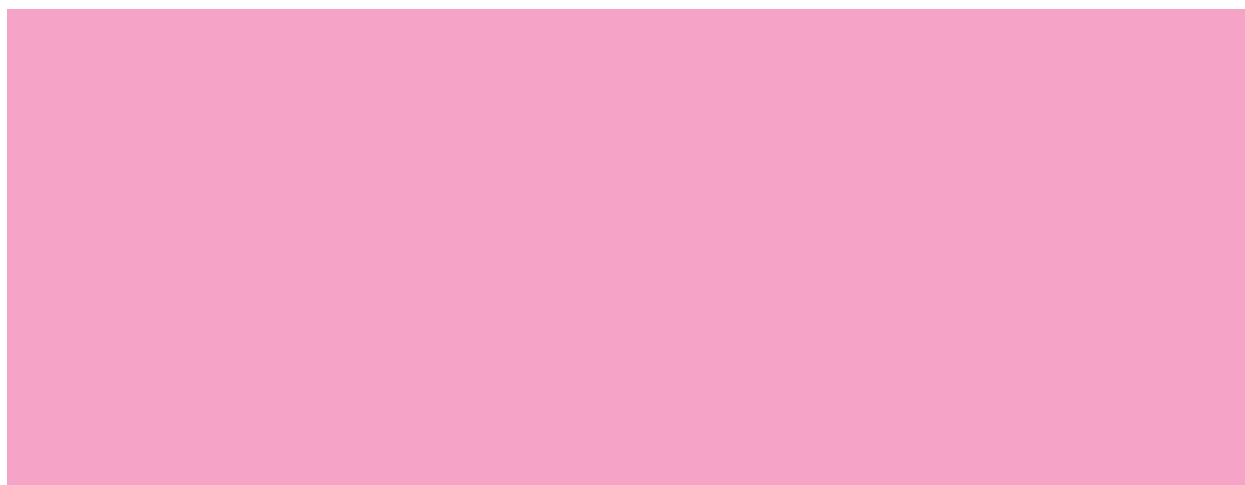

#### My Village, My Town

##### Objective of the study

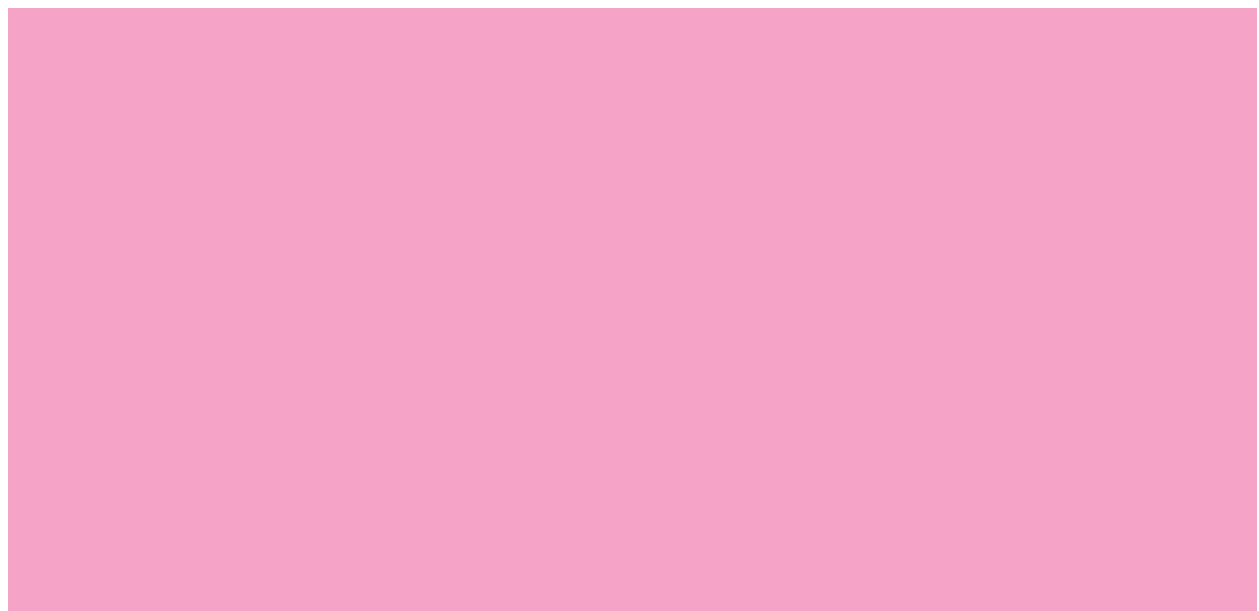
To understand and engage in developing modern civic facilities in the villages as part of the implementation of the manifesto of the government. To develop every village with facilities of the modern town, including developed roads, communication, safe drinking water, modern healthcare and proper treatment, standard education, developed sewerage, and waste management, increased electricity and fuel supply, computer and high-speed internet facilities, electric equipment and standard consumer goods. To increase agricultural production by using modern agricultural equipment and biofertilizer;

Bangladesh on the march towards Prosperity: Election Manifesto 2018. Paragraph 3.10 states 'MY VILLAGE—MY TOWN': EXTENSION OF MODERN CIVIC AMENITIES IN EVERY VILLAGE. Under this component, the participants went to their respective villages/selected villages. They studied the village, analyzed SWOT, and prepared a report including an action plan for development and submitted it to the module director.



## Disadvantaged Citizen Visits (DCV)

The objectives of DCV are to internalize the problems of Disadvantaged citizens. to understand how they are getting Public Services and to recall them at the time of policy formulation/implementation. To achieve the objectives the participants were sent to the most disadvantaged family. They identified at least one Disadvantaged Citizen (Beggar Family). visited the family's bedroom, kitchen, toilets, area of their home etc. identified Socio-economic problems of the family. Then the assessed the root causes of the problems, tried to include social security programs, identified instantly solvable problems; Internalizing and taking initiatives to solve the problem with the help of local authority; observed Public Service Delivery to the poor. They recommended to improve their living standard.



## District and Upazila

Evaluation Method: Group Report, Group Presentation and Individual Conduct Assessment

Total Marks: 50 (District level: GP-20, ICA-10 (Attendance -5, ICA -5) and at BPATC: GR-20)

Module Objectives: To present the opportunity for the participants to know the practical aspects of the field administration, changing dynamics of the rural society, history and economy and the potentials of Bangladesh.

### Week 1: District Attachment

Observing and understanding the functions and role of the District Development Coordination Committee (DDCC)

Learning the objectives and functions of all district level public offices including a potential cooperative society/a potential firm/NGO

Studying the Annual Performance Agreements (APA) of different departments

Observing and knowing the satisfaction of the service seekers and different stakeholders

Studying different accountability and transparency tools (eg. Citizen Charter/NIS/GRS/RTI/APA) of different offices to analyse the impact of it on the service delivery

### Week 2: Upazila Attachment

The Upazila attachment activity will have two components: (i) studying functions of Upazila level offices and local government institutions and economically disadvantaged households, and (ii) studying service delivery by Upazila level offices. The tasks include the following:

#### Component 1

Studying the functions and role of the Upazila Parishad

Studying the roles and functions of the local government institutions (LGIs)

#### Component 2

Module Director of Module -4 and the CMT will assign task and coordinate the activities.

### Week 3: Knowing Bangladesh/District Potentials

This activity is to meet the requirement of Module-1 (Module: 1A Bangladesh and Bangabandhu Studies and Module: 1B Bangladesh at a Glance: History & Culture). Upon finishing the visit participants will be required to submit individual report on the visits.

## BARD, RDA, BAPARD

To make the participants aware of the history, concept and techniques of rural development; and the transformation of the rural economy and society of Bangladesh.



## Secretarial Attachment

**Event:** Secretarial Attachment

**Participants:** 73rd FTC Participants and Official/Staff of BPATC

**Date:** 27th & 28th July 2022

**Venue:** Bangladesh Secretariat

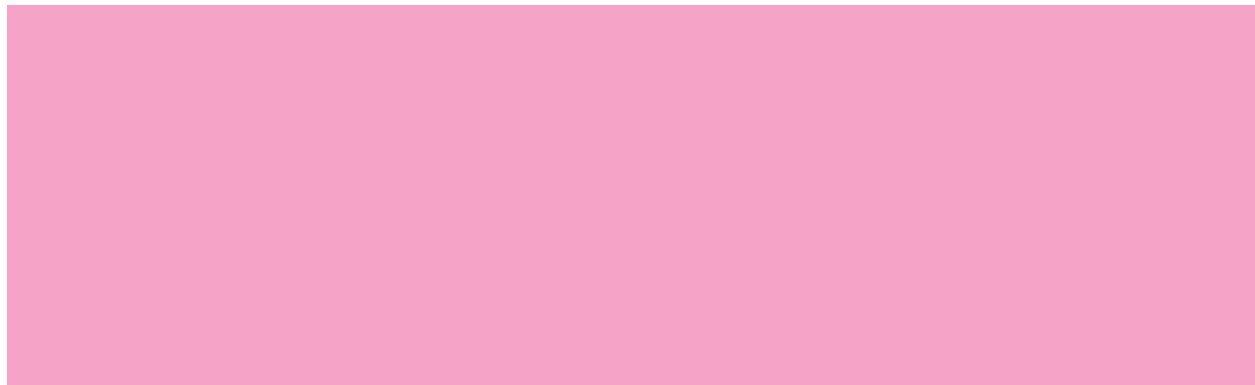
Secretarial attachment is an integral part of FTC. The Secretariat is the highest level decision-making and policy-making organ of the country. The Secretariat acts as a bridge between the administrative and executive bodies of the Government. Every Republic employee must be familiar with the administrative structure and functions of the Secretariat as well as its decision-making processes, filing, storage and management and final disposal. For this purpose on 27th and 28th July 2022, the trainees of BPATC of 73rd Foundation Training Course were given attachments to various Ministries/Departments.

**Purpose:**

- (a) To impart to the trainees a fair understanding of the administrative structure, functions and decision-making processes of the concerned Ministries;
- (b) Informing the decision-making process from the beginning to the final disposition of a specific issue in a policy document;
- (c) Provide a practical understanding of the rules and regulations of document storage, management and presentation as per Bangladesh Secretariat Instructions.

On the first day of attachment, the Secretary of the Ministry/Department usually guides the trainees in various aspects of the administrative structure and functions of the Ministry/Department and career. After that various high-level officials of the Ministry/Department gave a briefing about the Directorates, Department, Division, Sub-Divisions and Attached Offices under the Ministry/Department. During this time they informed the trainees about document management and the decision-making process. On the second day of attachment, the trainees visit two or more Directorates or Departments under the Ministries/Departments and review the functions of those departments with the officials and do various case studies.

Secretariat attachment imparts the trainees with a clear understanding of office management and working environment and policy formulation, which will be of full help in developing them as competent officers and future policymakers.



## Study Tours and Visits

Participants of 73rd FTC along with CMT visited 'Bangabandhu Memorial Museum', 'Muktijuddho Museum', 'National Museum of Science and Technology' and 'Bangladesh Military Museum' to know about the history and culture of Bangladesh. Here in BPATC trainees usually took part in theoretical sessions conducted by eminent guest speakers. However the visits to these museums brought opportunities for them to learn the history, culture and the spirit of independence practically.

### Tungipara, Gopalganj Visit

**Event:** Tungipara, Gopalganj Visit

**Participants:** 73rd FTC Participants and Official/Staff of BPATC

**Date:** 03 August 2022

**Venue:** Tomb of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman

Tungipara, a traditional Upazila of the Gopalganj district, is home to the birth memory of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the great architect of the Bengali nation. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the symbol of the hopes and aspirations of the Bengali nation and the great hero of liberation, is lying in eternal peace in this mausoleum of Tungipara. As part of the 73rd FTC organized and supervised by the Bangladesh Public Administration Training Center to inculcate the ideals of the Father of the Nation in the new officers who have joined the Bangladesh Civil Service, the trainees who participated in the said course visited the tomb of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman at Tungipara, Gopalganj on August 03, 2022.

On 03 August 2022, at 08:00 AM, the trainees and the respected members of the course management team simultaneously started the journey from BPATC premises towards Tungipara and crossed the Padma Bridge, a symbol of Bengali unity and prosperity, and reached Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's Mausoleum at 12:00 PM. Then, under the supervision of the course management team, the trainees paid their respects at the altar of Bangabandhu's mausoleum and participated in a special prayer to pray for the souls of Bangabandhu and his martyred family members. Later, the trainees visited the various spectacular structures of the tomb complex. The beauty of the shrine complex on the banks of the Baigar River in Tungipara and the craftsmanship of the edifice built on the lines of Greek architecture with red ceramic bricks and black and white tiles enthralled the trainees.

Then at 02:00 pm, the trainees completed the lunch at the Zilla Parishad Rest House Vijay premises under the supervision of the Upazila Nirbahi Officer, Tungipara. The trainees then visited the library and museum located in the complex. The trainees also visited the Research Centre, Exhibition Centre, Open Stage, Public Plaza, Administration Building, Cafeteria, Bakultala Square and Souvenir Corner located in the complex premises.

Finally, at 04:00 PM the trainees and respected members of the course management team started their return journey from Tungipara and returned to BPATC at 08:30 PM after completing a successful visit to the Tomb of the Father of the Nation. This unique experience of a group trip to Tungipara, where Bangabandhu's memory is enmeshed, will be forever etched in the memories of the trainees and will serve as a source of inspiration for building the Sonar Bangla of the Father of the Nation's dream in the future.

The course management team has arranged a discussion program participated by the Faculty members and participants of different ongoing training courses to mark the 92nd birth anniversary

of Bangamata Sheikh Fojilatunnesa Mujib. Mr. Ramendra Nath Biswas, Rector (Secretary to Govt.), BPATC has attended the program as chief guest chaired by Mis. Baby Rani karmakar, MDS, BPATC.

Born on 8 august 1930 at Tungipara village in Gopalgang, Begum Fojilatunnesa was brutally killed by the assassins of Father of the Nation on August 15 in 1975. She was the best political shadow companion of Bangabandhu and worked behind the scenes to implement His political philosophy and ideals. She was also the main motivation and encouragement behind writing Bangabandhu's autobiography. Her contribution, inspiration and sacrifice in the transformation from Sheikh Mujib to Father of Nation are undeniable. Because of that Bangabandhu was able to sow the dream of independence in the mind of the nation and bring its taste.

Overall, the program was very much informative. Participants had an opportunity to learn about Bangamata Begum Fojilatunnesa's devotion, patriotism, and bravery most of which were unknown to us previously. She will forever be remembered for her unique role in the political history of this country.



### Visit to National Parliament:

**Venue:** National Parliament, Asad Gate, Dhaka.

Attachment to the National Parliament is another beauty of FTC. Through the programme, the trainees get the unique opportunity to enjoy the architectural magnificence of where the country's laws are made. On the 16th of August 2022, the participants of the 73rd FTC moved to the 'National Parliament'. All the trainees were divided into four groups. Cox's Bazar is the heart of tourism of the country. 213 participants of 73rd FTC, along with the CMT, visited Cox's Bazar, which is known for its serenity, especially during the sunrise & sunset. It is not only famous for its long natural sandy sea beach but also its fantastic hospitality, fresh seafood, marine drive, kutubdia, Moheshkhali Island, and amazing St. Martin's Island. The trainees of the 73rd FTC got this opportunity which is not very common in FTC. There was a panel discussion on the problem and prospects of tourism industry in Bangladesh with especial reference to Cox's Bazar. Deputy Commissioner, Superintendent of Police Cox's Bazar and Additional Commissioner, office of the Refuge Relief and Repatriation Commissioner took part in the discussion. Deputy Commissioner presented a paper on the development of Cox' Bazar. It includes tourism, blue economy, fisheries and salt industry and so on. Discussant also discussed the initiatives implemented by concern departments

to attracts the tourists in Cox's Bazar. There was question answer sessions which made the sessions more attractive. Participants also visited Himchari, Marine drive and other important places. BPATC, the flagship training centre of the country located at Savar, organized a series of programmes to pay tribute to the martyrs who sacrificed their lives to give us independence in 1971.

BPATC Rector, also a Secretary to the Government, Mr Ramendra Nath Biswas hoisted the national flag on the premises of the centre. Member Directing Staffs, Directors, Deputy Directors, faculty members of the Centre and the participants of the 73rd Foundation Training Course (FTC) also attended the programme.

A team comprised of BPATC faculty members and participants from the 73rd FTC sang the national anthem while the BPATC Rector hoisted the national flag simultaneously. Apart from this, the participants of 73 rd FTC led by the BPATC top authorities placed a wreath at Savar national monument in the early morning to pay tribute to our martyred heroes. The BPATC premises got a festive look as colourful flags were hoisted and lighting was arranged at the buildings and monuments of the centre to mark the occasion.

Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman declared independence in the wee hours of March 26 after the Pakistani forces had brutally cracked down on the unarmed people of then East Pakistan on the night of March 25, 1971.

Valiant Bangalees took up arms and fought for independence under the leadership of Bangabandhu. The long-cherished victory was finally achieved on December 16, at the cost of blood and the untold suffering of people. Three million people sacrificed their lives in the war of liberation. Apart from this, around three lakhs of women were brutally tortured by the Pakistani army and their collaborators during the nine months of the war.

## Observance of the 92nd Birth Anniversary of Bangomata Begum Fazilatun Nesa Mujib

The participants of 73rd FTC took part on the observance of the 92nd Birth Anniversary of Bangomata Begum Fazilatun Nesa Mujib. They came to learn about the supreme sacrifice contribution of Bangamata regarding the independence of Bangladesh. She always inspired our father of the nation Bangabondhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to work for the nation.

August is a dark chapter in the history of the Bengali nation, a sad month. Just three and a half years after breaking the chain of slavery of a thousand years and achieving great independence in 1971, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the proverbial man of freedom, the father of the Bengali nation and the architect of Bangladesh, was brutally killed in this month of 1975.

Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre, 15th August 2022 was celebrated with due dignity by the faculty members, officers and employees of the centre along with the trainees of ACAD, SSC and 73rd FTC. Documentaries on Bangabandhu's life and work and discussion sessions on "Bangabandhu and Public Administration" provided the trainees with a sound understanding of Bangabandhu and the history of Bangladesh. The main negotiator at the meeting, Mohammad Farasuddin, former Governor of Bangladesh Bank, gave important talks from his personal life about Bangabandhu and public administration, which will play an important role in the career of the trainees. Besides, the honourable Rector along with various level officials and employees of the centre held a significant discussion.

The progress of Bangladesh started with the achievement of great independence on December 16, 1971, and Bangabandhu's homecoming in 1972; it was destroyed in the bud on August 15, 1975. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was killed by barbaric assassins at his residence on Dhanmondi road number 32 on this dark night.

By killing Bangabandhu, the assassins wanted to stop the development of Bangladesh. Bangabandhu's initiative to establish Bangladesh as a progressive, humane and developed state by freeing it from the fervour of capitalism, religious extremism, and social anarchy-inequality-disparity to implement the spirit of the liberation war was a threat to the killers, in the wake of which this cruel black chapter of Bangladesh was created.

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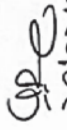

He had the privilege of coming into contact with great leaders such as President Breznev, President Tito, President Soekarona, Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, Prime Minister Whitlam, President Wilson, Senator Kennedy and so on.
